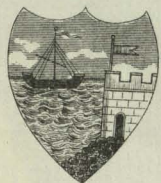

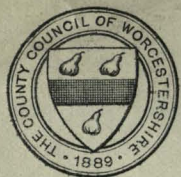

RULES FOR ADMISSION OF STUDENTS.

1898.

NATIONAL GALLERY.

RULES FOR ADMISSION OF STUDENTS.

STUDENTS are admitted to copy in the National Gallery on Thursdays and Fridays between 10 a.m. and 5 p.m. (or 4 p.m. in winter), subject to the following Rules:—

1. Each Applicant for admission is required to write a letter to the Keeper, giving the *name and address of a Referee* resident in London, and sending a specimen of the Applicant's work in oil or water-colour, *signed or otherwise authenticated*.

2. In cases where the Applicant has recently exhibited at the Royal Academy, or any other well-known Exhibition of pictorial Art in London, a letter giving the title of the picture and the date of the Exhibition, with the *name and address of a Referee* resident in London, will suffice.

3. In cases where the Applicant is a Student of the Royal Academy, or of any Government School of Art in London, a letter of recommendation from the Keeper of the Royal Academy, or from the Head Master of such Government School, will suffice, and should be enclosed in the letter of application.

4. A Card of Admission once issued will be always available, unless it is for any special reason withdrawn by authority. *Should the card be lost or mislaid, the Student will be required to make a fresh application for admission in conformity with the foregoing Rules.*

5. Students attending at the Gallery on Thursdays and Fridays are required to show their admission cards, sign their names and enter their numbers in a book kept for that purpose in the Entrance Hall.

6. Not more than one copying place in the gallery can be reserved for one Student at the same time, and in order to prevent inconvenient crowding, not more than *two* Students are permitted to copy from the same picture. *No exception can be made to this rule.*

7. Students desiring to copy from a picture, the places before which are already occupied, should leave their names with the Curator in charge, who will assign them places in order of the date of their application. Those who only attend on one day of the week cannot have places reserved for them to the exclusion of other Students who attend on both days.

8. Any Student engaged in copying a picture, and being absent for an entire day without having given notice in writing to the Keeper before the end of the day, will forfeit his or her place, if another application be made for it meanwhile, and must in that case await the next vacancy. *In such notice the title of the picture and number of the room should be distinctly stated.*

9. Students wishing to have the glass removed from glazed pictures, when finishing their copies, should apply (*a week previously*) to the Curator in charge, who will communicate such request to the Keeper, without whose sanction no glass is to be taken off. *Copies must be removed from the Gallery by their owners within a fortnight after completion.*

10. Any Lady Student desiring to be accompanied by a relation or friend during her studies must give notice to that effect in a letter to the Keeper, *stating the number of her Student's card*; and such relation or friend will only be entitled to free admission when provided with a ticket, and *in company with* the Lady Student who has thus applied.

11. Students will be required to keep their chairs, easels, canvasses, sketch books, and brushes outside the rail fixed for the protection of pictures, or where there is no rail, at such a reasonable distance as may preclude the chance of accidents. In no case is the surface of the picture to be touched.

12. A scrupulous attention to order and cleanliness will be expected from Students. Palettes and brushes are not to be washed in the Lavatories; separate accommodation being provided for that purpose. Chairs and sketching stools are provided in the Gallery, but Students are required to bring their own easels. Information on this and similar matters may be obtained on application to the Curators.

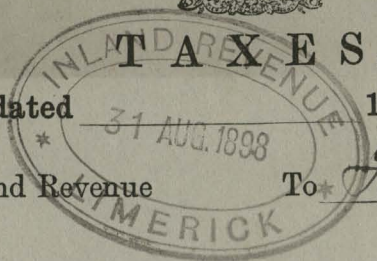



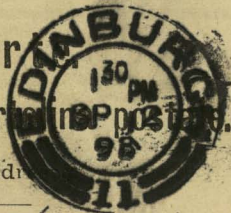

This humble institution is only in its infancy and little can therefore be said on that account; but there are numerous similar institutions in this town and elsewhere

Dunfermline, in the County
of Fife, is a royal and ancient

the northern part of Great Britain —

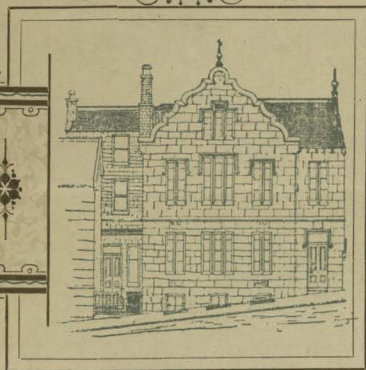

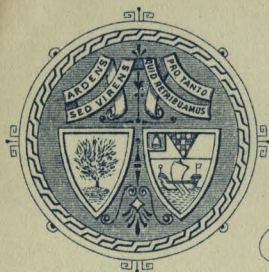

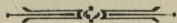
